Retreat planning: Much of this first board meeting revolved around discussing goals for 2025 and planning for the 2025 board retreat. The board meets for a full day to plan for the year, which will start with inclusion of goals from the LCUUF fellowship.

Congregational Workshop: We are working on a date for a full congregational workshop to set our LCUUF priorities. Please be thinking about what is most important to you in your LCUUF community. What brought you to LCUUF? Where do you want to see LCUUF focus in the community? More information following the board retreat.

Finances: Financial We are in solid financial shape, reported by Larry Pihl, our new treasurer. Together with Ted Fahy, our vice-president and volunteer bookkeeper, Larry and Ted are rebuilding our accounting database using Quickbooks. This should end with easy to view financial reports. Larry reported that last year 943,000 MX pesos were pledged, with 804,000 MX pesos collected. We discussed how to best follow-up on pledges, your ideas are appreciated. Our budget, each year, is made based on pledges. Share the basket for January collected 15, 370 MX pesos, all of those funds went directly to the organization of the month.

Sunday Service: Committee The Sunday Service Committee will have a retreat on April 30th. This vital committee plans for the weekly Sunday services. (ANYTHING ABOUT OTHERS WHO MIGHT WANT TO ATTEND?)

Social Action committee: Dee Dee Camhi has stepped forward to chair this critical committee. Thank you Dee Dee. Kriss Gang shared that the Food Bank is wanting to collaborate with LCUUF. 
