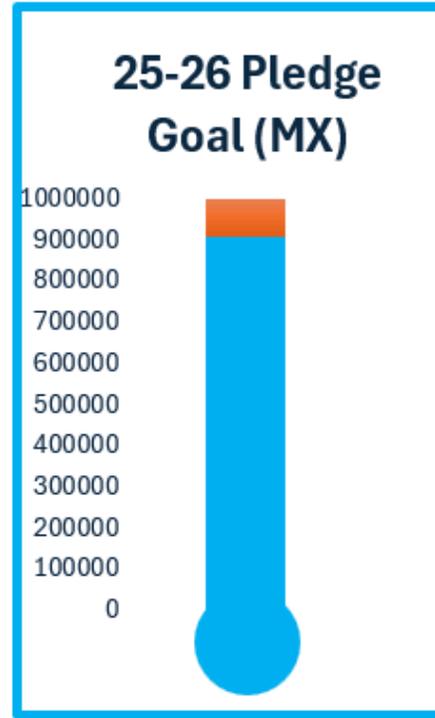
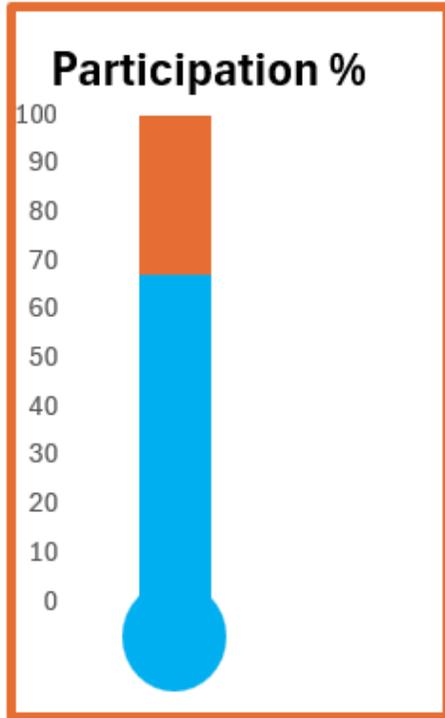

## **FINAL PLEDGE CAMPAIGN RESULTS**

A total of \$907,035 pesos was pledged by 74 pledging units out of a potential 111, which represents a participation rate of only 67%. Both pesos pledged and participation are less than 2024-2025. The proposed budget will now be adjusted downward, approved by the board and presented to the congregation at our annual meeting on Sunday, January 19th for approval.

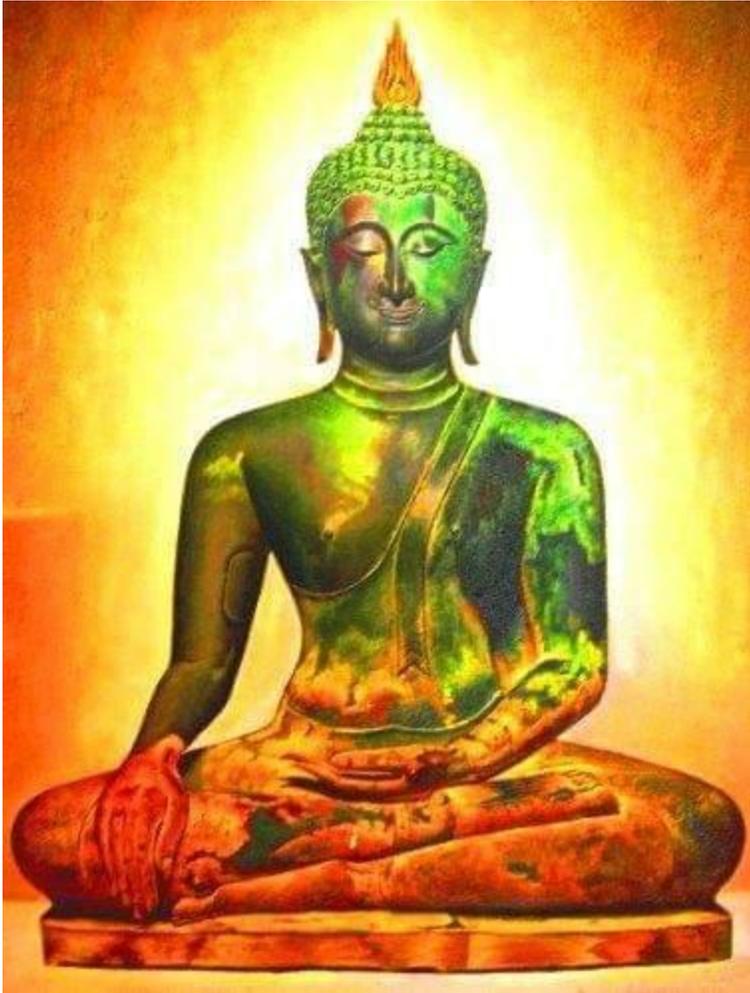
