hold infinity in the palm of your hand,

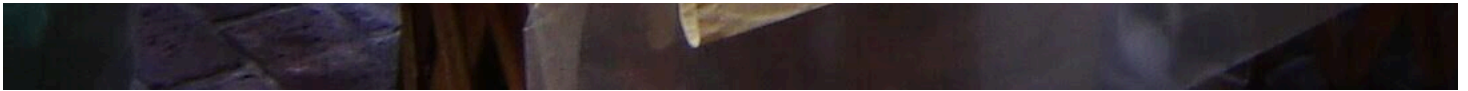
and eternity in an hour.

Each year for many years, St. Andrew's Anglican Church had a harvest meal between the Canadian and American Thanksgivings. Last year the Lake Chapala Unitarian Universalist Fellowship Presbyterian Church will join us this year.

The Harvest Comida 2025 will be at Manix II on Sunday, November 9. Appetizers will be at 4:00 p.m. and dinner at 5:00 p.m. The cost is \$520 per person, plus drinks. There will be a basket c

The menu will include appetizers, turkey, gravy and dressing, cranberry sauce, mashed potatoes and sweet potatoes, corn souffle, vegetables, bread and butter, and pumpkin pie with whippe

The gluten free and vegetarian options are azteca soup, or minestrone soup, or potato leak soup, and quinoa salad with black bean, corn, sweet red peppers, jicama, artichokes, herbs, mang
